Assignment brief



Scenario -

You have been approached by the Speakers' Corner Trust, a national charity which promotes free expression, to design and create a website for a Medway Speakers' Corner project, currently being developed. There are other regional Speakers' Corner projects which have their own websites, but the Medway site should give information about the project in a way that is specific to the Medway area. The website should, ideally, be responsive and created using HTML5, CSS3 and Javascript so that it works on the widest range of devices possible. It should be optimised to display appropriately on each device, taking account of the screen size and controls.

You should start by researching the other regional sites (<u>http://www.speakerscornertrust.org/speakers-corner-projects/uk-projects/</u>) for initial ideas.

A logo for the site and relevant pictures will be supplied later in the project and you should ensure that placeholders are built into the site. It is important that the site is easy to update for those who will be running the new project and a content management system such as Joomla or Wordpress will be used to develop the site.

Tasks (P4, P5, M2, M3, D3)

- 1. Design all pages. Your design must consist of:
 - navigation diagram showing pages with indicative content.
 - the specific requirements of the website that you are addressing with your design (you must describe how you intend to ensure minimum download times and maximum visibility for your pages on search engines).

THE DEADLINE FOR TASK 1 is 28th April 2014

THE CLIENT WILL EVALUATE THE DESIGNS ON THE 29th APRIL AND THIS DEADLINE MUST BE MET WITHOUT FAIL.

- 2. Create first copy of all pages, following your design and following the requirements of the brief. You must:
 - build a set of working pages using HTML/CSS/Javascript
 - have navigation to all areas on all pages
 - include placeholders for all content that is being provided later

THE DEADLINE FOR TASK 2 is 12th May 2014

- 3. Make a final version of your website
 - include meta tags for keywords and descriptions
 - proof read all content
 - include some graphics, animation and audio in your pages and fully test that these work
 - ensure that all HTML/CSS code is W3C compliant and print out the results of your testing
 - test all parts of all pages and record all changes you make as a result of this
 - upload your finished site to the college server for final testing and demonstration purposes

THE DEADLINE FOR TASK 3 is 6th June 2014

- 4. Write a report explaining:
 - how and where you might host the site and why this is suitable
 - what might be a suitable sub-domain name for the new site (as it may run alongside the existing site)
 - the techniques you have used to reduce download time
 - the techniques you have used to optimise search engine visibility
 - how you implemented the interactive parts of the site and the software development tools you used throughout the project

 5. Receive feedback from the client and document improvements you make in response to this. Write a report explaining: what needs to be improved and how you would do this how you will ensure that the site is secure how you will ensure that the website can be found either with or without a search engine how the site might be improved with the addition of Web 2.0 technologies in the future. THE DEADLINE FOR TASK 5 is 13th June 2014 					
Evidence Required:					
A word-processed report covering all the requirements of the tasks as described above. Your report must have: a suitable title page showing the title, date and your name; section headings and appropriate diagrams; page numbers. The work for tasks 2 and 3 will be included in the report as diagrams representing your design and screenshots showing your completed website, which must be hosted on the college's student server for demonstration and testing purposes.
